For Such a Time as This

One thing I've learned through the years is that the missions call is both personal and progressive. This truth couldn't be truer than in the lives of Timothy and Janela Meacham. It gives me great joy to introduce this couple as our newest missionary candidates to the Country of Russia. Here is their story:



"It is with great appreciation that we write this letter of introduction. Your consideration for support of the call which we sense upon our lives is a humbling, yet invigorating, opportunity.

A little over a decade ago, we departed Yuma, AZ for Guadalajara, Mexico. We had served for nearly ten years as the Directors of Youth Ministry at Yuma First Assembly. During this

time, Tim also served in the United States Marine Corps, followed by several years with the Department of Defense. In Guadalajara, we had the privilege to serve as the Interim Directors of Engage, a college-aged missions study abroad program. From there, we followed the Lord's leading to Springfield, Mo, where we have been since 2012. Most recently, we have served in the National Office of the Assemblies of God in Assemblies of God World Missions (AGWM). Tim oversees the AGWM Pipeline and is part of the Global Crisis Management team. Janela is the office manager for the AGWM Mobilization and Development department.

While serving in Springfield, our call to serve cross-culturally never faded. Over a meal, the Russia Area Directors inquired if we had ever considered serving in Russia. Truthfully, we had not! However, we committed to pray, give, and go as the Lord directed.

That meal was several years ago, and like yeast in dough, the call to service in Russia began to grow. One question influenced our hearts to consider something we hadn't previously.

Our path has led us to this exact point in time, a moment we cannot deny as directed by the Lord. After careful and concentrated prayer, wise counsel, and undeniable confirmations from the Lord, it is with certainty that we can say that God has called us to serve in the largest country in the world. Russia has a population of 149 million and 88 unreached people groups, with most having never had an opportunity to hear the truth of Christ's sacrifice for them. The AGWM team in Russia is growing, with efforts in evangelism, campus ministry, and partnership with the Russian national church. Our desire, and what we sense the Lord is calling us to do, is help establish an effort which will serve as an entry point to share the Gospel cross-demographically. In addition, we will be serving in the area of member care for the team the Lord is calling and developing to serve across Russia. Details are coming and we expectantly wait for the Lord to reveal them in His time.

As we journey on the path set before us, we appreciate your consideration for us for prayer and financial support. It is only with a strong partnership team that we will be able to accomplish all the Lord has for us to do in Russia.

We are proud to be a part of the Arizona Network. Tim entered into ministry in Arizona. As a third-generation AZ minister, Janela's roots run deep in the Southwest desert. We are greatly looking forward to being at Network Conference this year. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us. We look forward to hearing from you."

A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a broken spirit dries up the bones.
- Proverbs 17:22



In a recent Pastors' Zoom call, our book for discussion was Carey Nieuwhof's "Didn't See it Coming." It focuses on seven challenges that sneak up on us in pastoral leadership: things like cynicism, compromise, emptiness, burnout, etc. (I would highly recommend it to you.) In one paragraph, Nieuwhof touches on the role laughter plays in a leader's health. It concerned me...

I realized it had been quite a while since I had laughed hard, as in an eye squinting, breath choking, belly tightening kind of laughter. And I missed it. Laughter carries a cathartic quality in our lives, doesn't it? It's almost cleansing and renewing to laugh really hard. It's no wonder that Proverbs stresses the importance of a happy heart and beginning with Sarah, we see much laughter throughout God's word.

In 1997, we were invited to a young couple's home who were new to our church. Carla and I enjoyed table games with them, while our three girls ran around with their three boys that night. We later learned that the wife called her mother and said, "They're real! Our new pastors are real! His wife even snorted she laughed so hard!" A friendship was birthed that extends to today and has been life-giving to us ever since. And in reflection, it speaks to the desire many have for authentic, genuine moments with their pastors!

When I arrived at Central Assembly years ago, I was struck at the atmosphere in the board meetings. They began with a meal, and yet still, the spirit around the table was sober and quiet. I knew this had to change, and over the next few months I made sure to lighten the atmosphere from the start. I felt it important, no matter how serious the subjects we would later deal with.

How about you today? How often do you laugh? When is the last time it was more than chuckle? I would encourage you to think about what really brings you joy and work it into your busy schedule. If you're married, make sure to laugh together. As you lead your staff or volunteers, make sure there is plenty of joy in the midst of your work.

Steps to Consider Laughter:

- Do a study in the gospels and see if Jesus laughed.
- Consider the same about God in the Old Testament.
- Evaluate what makes you laugh—and do it!
- Ask the Holy Spirit for more joy.
