





**DEPLOYED**: To spread out so as to form an extended front or line;

To arrange in a position of readiness, or to move strategically or appropriately;

to come into a position ready for use!

Hallelujah! Do you sense God speaking to your heart? We are being spread out to extend the front line of the Gospel. We are being rearranged in a position of readiness, moving strategically, coming into position to be used of the Holy Spirit for such a time as this! That will preach, Pastor.

Our son, Kyle, turned 30 last December and I was reminiscing about his life and how God had brought him though some incredible difficult seasons, much like the season we're in right now with COVID-19. 30 years ago we served under Craig and Jeannette Carter as associate pastors in San Diego and the Lord opened a door for us to begin our first pastorate in Silverthorne, Colorado. At the time we were waiting for the birth of Kyle, but once he was born we moved from Southern California (sea level) to the Rocky Mountains of Colorado (9,000 feet of elevation).

We arrived 8 days after Kyle was born and sadly, within days, he became seriously ill, stricken with RSV, a respiratory virus that could be fatal for babies in high altitude. We took Kyle to the only small clinic in town and after being evaluated, his doctor first shared with us that two infants had succumbed to the virus. He then gave us the news that Kyle didn't have much of a chance for survival. As you can imagine, Sue and I were heartbroken to think we would lose our child. Sue spent the night in the clinic with Kyle and prayed nonstop, asking God for a miracle. Kyle survived the night but because of our recent move, we didn't have insurance and we were discharged from the hospital.

A board member, who was also a commercial refrigeration technician, came to our house and built a makeshift oxygen tent, and for the next two weeks we cared for Kyle 24/7, asking God to free his little body of this deadly virus. Then it happened. God showed up and a miracle happened before our eyes. Kyle went from being critically ill to thriving as a newborn infant.

We took him back to the doctor and after listening to his lungs, he said to us, "Your son has had something happen to him that I can't explain." Then he said, "I hear no evidence that he has ever had the virus in his lungs; what did you do?" And we said, "We didn't do anything except PRAY MORE!" Then he said, "Keep doing what you're doing because it's working!"

Network Family, I share this miracle story to remind all of us that prayer is the answer to get us through this crisis. I know from a natural perspective, things seem desperate, but as God's chosen people, we must turn our minds and hearts to the things that work. Throughout the bible you'll find a God who desires to move on behalf of those who cry out to Him. "If my people!" I believe, now more than ever, the church should be calling out to God, asking Him to heal the land of this virus. Prayer changes everything! During this time of social distancing, let's build altars of prayer in our homes and cry out to God, as did the saints of old.

When you're praying, please remember our missionaries. Because of the coronavirus, many have been asked to return home or have been relocated to less contagious places in the world, while others are in complete lock down. This is a difficult time for our missionary family, including those who are itinerating to raise the necessary funds to be released to the field. I encourage you to not only continue your support for our missionaries, but to also pray fervently for their protection and courage. We know God is sovereign and in control of everything that happens in our lives, but we are also are invited by Him to offer intercessory prayer in this critical time in history. Thank you for your faithfulness!



# NOTE TO SELF... MIND THE EMOTIONS!

"Remove grief and anger from your heart..." Eccle. 11:10

"Jesus wept." John 11:35

How fitting this subject is in light of our current world-wide crisis! As of this writing, we are all under a governor-imposed quarantine in our homes, posting online services and day to day ministry, and wondering how long this pandemic will last and its ultimate, residual impact. Amidst it all we are reminded that we truly are emotional beings.

As we walk through the P.I.E.S.S. (physical, intellectual, emotional, spiritual, social) reflection of how God created each of us, emotions may be the most challenging to understand. No question, as we move through the early chapters of Scripture—from Noah to the Exodus—we recognize that indeed, we are made in the image of God. For, He indeed, is an emotional God!

Yet, the two extremes cited in our verses above reflect how many approach human emotions. Some want to stifle them "remove grief and anger..." and others are willing to release them "Jesus wept." Which is correct? Both, actually. Proverbs warns us that "a fool always loses his temper" (29:11) and "he who is slow to anger is better than the mighty, and he who rules his spirit, than he who captures a city" (16:32). Yet, Jesus' open display of tearful grief speaks heavily to our license (and need) to release our deepest emotions.

As a pastor just said to me yesterday, "by keeping busy in this quarantine, my emotions stay up and more positive." I am sure we all can relate. The "cave" experience in Scripture often led to a sense of loss, and even depression. Elijah (post-Mt. Carmel) and David (the psalms) are great examples. Our homes can become "caves" in this strange season. So, yes, we must be aware of our emotions.

A few suggestions have come from my recent dialogues with pastors:

Contemplate your emotions with God - The psalms are a template. I recall George Wood stating how in many 'seasons' of his life, he found the psalms perfectly reflective of where he was at in his emotions.

Stay busy - That pastor had it right:cooped up for days/weeks can lead to too much contemplation and inward thought. Keep outward-focused, other-minded.

**Exercise** - Sure, you can do it. One pastor mentioned that some gyms are offering free on-line exercise programs for all physical levels during this quarantine. Keep moving!

Schedule your day(s) - Another pastor said his typical week has flipped in this strange season. So, stop to organize your daily and weekly rhythms.

Embrace the 'moment' - We have never seen this before and may never again. Make it an adventure with your spouse or kids. You can grieve it or celebrate it. You know which will bring the best out of you and all around you!

**Practice joy -** If it is a fruit of the Spirit, then now's the time to experience God-given joy! The best definition of joy a pastor-friend gave me years ago is: "The confidence in knowing God is in control of my circumstances" (i.e. Paul to the Philippians).



Pastors, you are rocking it across our great state! You are doing ministry like never before. It's exciting to see...and the more positive we remain, the better off we will be both inwardly and outwardly.
