My Mom, Enola Ruth Harris, lived to be 94 years old. Her body wracked and weak, bound to a wheelchair, but she could still quote scripture and call on the Lord in prayer for her children, grandchildren, and siblings. She would tell you herself that the Word of God was her anchor. It is mine as well.



I give an instructional charge to our Ordination candidates every Network Conference that always stirs my own heart concerning the high calling of God to ministry:

"In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead and in view of His appearing and His Kingdom, I give you this charge: 'Preach the Word; be prepared in season and out of season; Correct, Rebuke and Encourage.. .with great patience and careful instruction." -2 Timothy 4:1-2

Please notice these key words and phrases:

- 1. Preach the Word
- 2. Be prepared in difficult seasons as well as the mountain top seasons
- 3. Correct & Rebuke from the foundation of the truth of the Word of God
- 4. Encourage with 'great' patience and 'careful' instruction that lines up with the precepts of the Word of God.

We pray daily for you, Pastor, and are so appreciative for your faithfulness in this challenging time for our Nation, and most certainly the body of Christ. My encouragement to you is simple. One of the challenging aspects of pastoring is the pressure to always feel we must have an answer. Remember the 'ol Shell Answer Man from commercials? Sometimes I feel that way on a Sunday as I move in and out of conversations with the flock. The truth is: **people want answers**. There is a certain comfort when authority figures can provide opinion and information on a given subject.

Our current circumstances surrounding Covid-19 have heightened the uncomfortable reality that sometimes only God knows—period. Our highest authorities, the experts, have vacillated on their projections, recommendations, and speculations about the virus. How many times have you said to someone recently, "Only God knows"? Truthfully, such a saying is potentially frustrating to the inquirer, but to you as a pastor it can feel freeing.

David sang with his harp, "My heart is not proud, O Lord, my eyes are not haughty; I do not concern myself with great matters or things too wonderful for me" (Ps. 131:1). This cuts both ways in application. First, allow yourself the freedom to live David's premise here. Yes, even as a pastor on Sunday morning! There truly are some things we just don't know, can't know, and possibly God may never allow us to know. Second, be slow then, to speculate on matters. Why must we always have an answer? Quite possibly the inquiry is yet another perplexity that God is not divulging the answer to. Social media has promoted everyone to the position of opinion columnists on life...and politics, and religion, and...oh my.

#### So, here are a few recommendations for you, pastor:

- Allow yourself these words, "I simply don't know." It just might be a good sermon title right about now.
- Allow God to be esteemed as the great "mystery keeper" that He is. Lead your people in the worship of this unique aspect to His nature.
- Be careful with what you do know. Hold your opinion to yourself, even if you "know" the answer sometimes.
- Social media? Just be careful. Love people with it. Build up, don't tear down. Before you
  weigh in, ask yourself, "Do I know all the facts on this matter?" You most likely don't.
- Sure, seek God to know about the given secrets surrounding our lives. James 1 says He
  does not hold back giving us His wisdom. As leaders, wisdom may be our greatest need in
  this hour.




