It's funny how we forget the thousand acts of kindness shown by our parents but easily remember the one bad spanking.

Would I change the pages of the past if I could? Yes and no! In some applications I would, especially those created by my own sheer ignorance and rebellion. One thing I have learned is that sometimes "life happens" and there is no amount of contemplation or wishful nostalgia that can change past events. But rather than try to turn back the pages of our lives, we should instead focus on the special gift God has given His children: The natural ability to remember the best and the supernatural grace to forget and forgive the worst.

Our past does not identify who we are, nor does it serve as a predictor of how our lives will ultimately turn out. I'm so grateful God has forgiven and released me from my past and the memories I now have are pleasant and satisfying. *As Christians, we need to be careful how much time we spend in the past.*

So, as we begin another summer in Arizona, may I encourage you to take time to remember all the good things God has brought you through and then begin to set your sights on all the things He's planned for your future. **Both the past and the future possess a blessed reward.** Our greatest days are ahead not behind. Yesterday was good, but tomorrow will even be better.

Again, Sue and I want to thank all our pastors and churches that have remained faithful to our Arizona Ministry Network missionaries in the past and will continue to do so into the future. You are amazing!



We are concluding five months surrounding the P.I.E.S.S.—a great way to examine our health in life and ministry. God wants us all to be healthy physically, intellectually, emotionally, spiritually, and socially. Many a pastor has hit rock bottom by not filling up these 'battery cells' that so easily drain in the rigors of ministry.

One distinction between my dad's generation in ministry and mine was our approach to relationships within the church. My dad often cited the admonition from his bible college profs (early 1950's) to not grow close to people within the church, and for numerous reasons. I do not recall that advice from my days at CBC (early 1980's) and Carla and I chose to have close friendships within the three churches we have served in. We found them to be life-giving and possibly, life-saving at times.

Consider it this way: do you believe God wants every member of your church to have good, godly relationships? Of course you do! Yet, do you think God wishes the same for the shepherds of His flock? Trust me, God wants you to be healthy socially, even as you are in any other area of your life! (P.I.E.S.S.)

Let me recommend a few types of friends pastors need to cultivate:

- One who truly understands ministry. Look for someone who has previously pastored, carried credentials, or was raised in a ministry home. They can be a great sounding board or confidant in times that you need someone who understands your load. (If not, remember the AZMN Elder Ministry...and reach out to an elder!)
- One for crisis. Some people are uniquely wired with broad shoulders for tough times. Every pastor needs a friend that simply knows how to navigate tough waters, be a good listener, and collaborate over difficult matters with. (If you do not have such a person in your church, remember the AZMN Elder Ministry...and reach out to and elder!)
- One for strategizing with. Every pastor can glean from a business owner or strategic
 thinker in the church. Find someone that can help you 'do church' better. I have gleaned
 greatly from friends who had a well-trained eye for weaknesses in our church structure. (If
 you do not have such a person in your church, remember the AZMN Elder Ministry...and
 reach out to and elder!)
- One for sharing life with. Especially, if you are married, find another couple to share life with. We had close friends when we were without children, others when our children were growing up, and others now in our empty-nesting years. Those seasons naturally attract others in the same season, so take advantage of that commonality for your well-being.



You notice, I keep referencing our Elder Ministry. Yes, it is one safe place that you can turn to in order to gain what every pastors needs from time to time...a friend in ministry.


