Arizona Ministry Network family, we pray that this update finds you growing in the grace of God. Recently, Sue and I, along with Pastor Steve, had the privilege of attending the combined "Missions Connect" in San Antonio. It was a wonderful time of gathering with the Executive Leadership of our AGWM and AGUSM departments and we came away both CHALLENGED and BURDENED.

The CHALLENGE remains: We must prioritize all missions' endeavors, both home and abroad! 2 Cor. 2:15 instructs us to be a "pleasing aroma" to all the world. Like Christ on the Earth and the Holy Spirit in the Church, our presence not only brings encouragement to followers of Christ but attracts those who do not yet follow Him. Christ calls us and the Holy Spirit empowers us to live and minister among the whole world. In this way, we can be "Christ Among Us" to those who need Him. My challenge to you today: Make missions a priority!

And then the BURDEN, very much like yours, Pastor, is for the generation following behind. Regardless of where they serve in the world, missionary families say the same thing – their children are a special blessing and a big part of their work. Children matter to the expansion of the Kingdom, which is why they are a target of the enemy.

Beloved, hear my heart. The enemy's attack on the families of missionaries has escalated and many find themselves in a battle for the souls of their children. Eternity is at stake, and we must pray as never before.

This month, we are calling you to pray for the children, teens, and young adults of all our missionaries. These are the ones living and serving on the frontlines of the expansion of the Kingdom of Light into dark places. Yes, it's a privilege, but it also means that they are targets for the enemy and therefore worthy of special prayer coverage.

Here are a few things you can ask the Lord for on behalf of our missionary kids (MKs):

- Pray that they learn to trust in Jesus for themselves. A MK's greatest need is Jesus so
 pray that they will make that personal commitment for themselves.
- Pray for spiritual growth that they'd put Jesus first, will be growing in their love for the Lord and be assured that Christ is with them in all circumstances.
- Pray for good relationships. Pray for honest and joyful relationships with their parents, for close friendships between siblings, and for them to make friends locally. Pray that relationships with friends and family back in the USA would be sustained, despite the distance.
- Pray for cultural adjustment. MK's face the challenge of not quite 'belonging' anywhere so
 pray that they will cope well with being different to their peers and that they'd appreciate
 their unique experiences.
- Pray for safety. Life can be unsafe living overseas: natural disasters, unstable
 governments, hazardous travel, pollution, inadequate medical care, foreign illnesses.
 Pray that the Lord would keep them safe and, if crisis hits, they will keep trusting that God
 is in control.
- Pray for transitions. MK's often have to cope with constant change, lots of goodbyes and moving often. Pray that they'd trust in God during transitions and be able to adjust quickly to new environments.
- Pray for sexual purity. MK's are also assaulted with the endless lies and confusion of the
 enemy's agenda to distort biblical sexual purity. Missionary families are being torn apart
 and the spiritual future of their sons and daughters is at stake. Pray for the protection of
 the Blood of Jesus over their minds, bodies and desires. Ask the Holy Spirit to help them
 understand they are created in God's image and that His plans for their lives is for good,
 to give them a future and a hope.

Thank you, Network family, for joining us in prayer for all our Arizona MK's.

What a privilege to lift our prayers together with Jesus, the Great High

Priest as He intercedes for these precious souls. May the Lord hear and respond to the prayers on behalf of His children!

ATTRIBUTES OF A HEALTHY CHURCH

The concept of a healthy church is one that has been discussed and debated for centuries. What makes a church healthy? How can we recognize a healthy church when we see one? These questions are important to consider, especially for those who are seeking a church home or are involved in church leadership. In this article, we will explore six key attributes of a healthy church.







1. Strong Community.

A healthy church has a sense of community & fosters meaningful relationships between its members. This includes opportunities for fellowship, outreach, and support.

2. Sound Doctrine

A healthy church is rooted in sound biblical doctrine and teaches the Gospel accurately and faithfully. It also values theological education and encourages its members to grow in their knowledge of the faith.

3. Servant Leadership.

A healthy church is led by individuals who prioritize servant leadership and model Christ-like behavior. Leaders are humble, approachable, and seek to serve others rather than seeking power or recognition.

4. Worshipful Atmosphere.

A healthy church creates an atmosphere of worship, where members are free to express their love for God and encounter His presence. Worship is focused on God and not on performance or entertainment.

5. Emphasis on Mission

A healthy church is passionate about reaching out to the community and sharing the love of Christ. This includes evangelism, service, and supporting global missions. Members are encouraged to use their gifts and talents to advance the mission of the church.

6. Empowerment of the Holy Spirit.

A healthy church recognizes the importance of the Holy Spirit in the life of the church and its members. It seeks to cultivate an environment where individuals can be empowered by the Spirit to live out their faith and use their gifts for the benefit of the community.

Over the next 6 publications, we will take a closer look at each of these attributes and explore how they can be cultivated in a church setting. By understanding these key components of a healthy church, we can work towards creating a church community that reflects the love and grace of Christ and empowers its members to live out their faith.



A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out.

Isaiah 42:3

I am focusing this series of monthly articles upon Dr. Lichi's teachings from our recent Network Tour. He graciously provided us his notes, as well as many other resources. I would strongly encourage you to go to our network website, under "resources" and find "2023 Network Tour" to download these materials.

Dr. Lichi's theme for much of the tour was, "The Way of the Warrior/Shepherd," emphasizing the contrast we all seek to fulfill in pastoral ministry: being tough minded like a warrior / tender hearted like a shepherd. He illustrated how each end of the spectrum reflects our Lord Jesus, who was warrior-like (i.e. in casting out the money changers from the temple), while tender-hearted as He ministered to the brokenness that abounded. What a picture of the range of ministry the demands of pastoral work call us to! (Again, check out his teaching materials on this contrast.)

Pastor Ryan Visconti of Generation Church recently spoke of this same contrast, but in terms of the "prophetic" and "priestly" personalities reflected by many pastors. He aptly articulated the contrasts of the prophet's delivering of truth, confronting of sin, and discerning spirit versus the priestly care for people, compassionate heart and comforting ways. Once again, we see this contrast of roles and personalities pastors share. (I would strongly encourage you to download Pastor Ryan's Leadership podcast and listen to February 14, 2023).

My challenge to you is to consider this spectrum of personality and ministry style. All of us are gifted and lean to one or the other. My teaching of these gifts focuses on the seven "Motivational gifts" of Romans 12 and specifically the prophet versus the mercy gifts. Bottom-line the demands of pastoral ministry will at times require the prophetic-gifted pastor to be more merciful and the mercy-gifted pastor to be more prophetic in style. The Lord will provide us the grace to be that warrior/shepherd He has called us to be.

Keys to being a faithful Warrior/Shepherd:

- Download the materials/podcasts mentioned and reflect on your ministry style.
- Discuss your personality/ministry gift with your spouse or a close friend and how it impacts your style of ministry.
- Reflect on ministry times that demand you to be more Warrior than Shepherd and vice versa.

REGIONAL TOUR 2023 RECAP!

Regional Tour 2023 is complete but our mission is just getting started. Over 750 students and leaders from many different churches attended six strategic locations throughout Arizona. Each night, our aim was to draw closer to Jesus and make room in our hearts for the Great Commission.

We are responding to the devastating earthquakes that hit Turkey and Syria, killing over 40,000 people and displacing over 5 million refugees from their homes. Speed the Light is partnering with Convoy of Hope to bring disaster relief to the victims and ultimately the gospel of peace through Jesus Christ.

Out of this message of living generously, 50 students responded to the call of God to be a missionary, many others to stand in the gap as intercessors, and over \$400,000 was promised in faith for Speed the Light in 2023. (If all of our 200+ churches gave \$2,000 this year, we would surpass this faith promise!) We had individual students make faith promises for \$800, \$5,000, and one student wrote \$21,100 on their faith promise card! This generation wants to live generously and sacrificially, no longer satisfied with the world's offerings. Our students are hungry for the real presence of God and are offering their lives to share Jesus with their friends, filling heaven!

The most inspiring stories from Regional Tour are the prophetic words students were hearing God speak. One student said, "God's grace is greater than any devastation." Another student said, "What is happening in Turkey and Syria is sad, but I believe God will be glorified and we will rebuild Turkey." In Yuma, one of our youth pastors shared a vision of a burning saguaro cactus, a desert on fire with God's Spirit.


