How to Pray

I would first like to say 'THANK YOU' for your faithful prayers for my recovery from my recent cardiac arrest. Sue and I are so grateful for every encouraging text, scripture, email, and phone call. We have felt your love and support and know how blessed we are to be a part of the Arizona Ministry Network.

Our missionaries feel the same way! As you know, the life of a full-time missionary is not for the faint of heart. They leave their homes, families, and everything they know for one purpose: to share God's message of hope and love with the world. In so doing, they need monthly financial support, ministry resources, curriculum, and equipment. They also need our words of encouragement. Sometimes they even ask for our physical presence to help with projects and outreaches.

But if you ask any missionary what they need the most, you will get one consistent, resounding request: "Please pray for us!" Allow me to share the following prayer points and scriptures that Sue and I often use as we pray over our Arizona missionary family. We pray for:

1. STRENGTH & PERSEVERANCE. Missionaries can often feel as though they've sown much with little harvest. Pray for their strength and endurance to run the race — that the Lord would remind them He is working deep in hearts even when it seems like nothing is happening.

"Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." – Isaiah 40:31

2. ENCOURAGEMENT. Pray against discouragement, disappointment, fear, and doubt. Ask the Lord to bring people across their path who would encourage and uplift them. Be that person yourself!

“Surely the righteous will never be shaken; they will be remembered forever. They will have no fear of bad news; their hearts are steadfast, trusting in the Lord.” – Psalm 112:6-7

3. PROVISION. On a tight, missionary budget, the smallest, unexpected expense can create a major financial strain. Pray for God’s provision over their family and ministry.

“And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.” – Phil. 4:19

4. PROTECTION AND SAFETY. Pray for our missionaries’ safety and protection. Ask the Lord to protect them against illness, injury, and danger.

“The LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.” – Psalm 121:8



5. JOY IN TRIALS. The joy of the Lord is our strength! Pray that the joy of the Lord will sustain our missionaries in every trial and setback.

“Those who sow with tears will reap with songs of joy. Those who go out weeping, carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, carrying sheaves with them.” – Psalm 126:5-6



6. DARKNESS LIFTED. Missionaries walk boldly into some of the darkest areas of the earth. They confront spiritual and physical oppression that we can't imagine. Pray that the light of God would shine through them, lifting darkness and oppression as they share His love.

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners." – Isaiah 61:1

7. DIVINE OPPORTUNITIES. Ask God to set up divine appointments and open doors for ministry that only He can make possible.

"Pray for us, too, that God may open a door for our message, so that we may proclaim the mystery of Christ, for which I am in chains. Pray that I may proclaim it clearly, as I should." – Colossians 4:3-4

8. OPEN HEARTS. Like the seeds that fell on fertile soil in the Parable of the Sower, ask the Lord to make fertile ground and prepare hearts to receive the gospel.

"I will give them a heart to know me, that I am the Lord. They will be my people, and I will be their God, for they will return to me with all their heart." – Jeremiah 24:7



Pastor, thank you for praying! Thank you for interceding and lifting our missionaries' hands by praying for them. Those prayers remain the greatest way we can support those we are sending out, invoking the very power of God to intervene in ways that are beyond our human limitations to save the lost.

Twentynine Eleven Church - NEW BUILDING!



Twentynine Eleven Church's Grand Opening in their new facility was on February 27th, 2022. There were over 600 people in attendance on that Sunday, including Pastor Stephen Harris and Marjorie. They recently opened escrow and will finish the journey into full ownership closing on June 1st, 2022. How they got from losing their space somewhat suddenly to being able to purchase a permanent home in a matter of months is nothing short of a miracle!

Their journey toward ownership has been challenging and has certainly stretched the faith and endurance of the entire staff and church. Tempe is a landlocked city with nearly all of its available land accounted for. New builds predominantly come from old buildings being demolished and then construction taking place on those pieces of property. This was the exact situation that forced them to move from the space that had been their home for over 5 years. The night before they had to be out of their building, they were given the green light to start meeting at the campus at 1137 Warner Rd on Sunday afternoons. That first Sunday was historic and powerful as vision filled the auditorium and leadership sensed that this was their new home. In early January, they were given the opportunity to fully take the campus, signing a lease with the intention to own within 12 months. Twentynine Eleven is living in a miracle that only God could accomplish! They will be full owners of the property within 6 months of when the lease papers were signed.





NOTE TO SELF.. **Stay Teachable**

**Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser;
teach a righteous man, and he will increase in learning. - Proverbs 9:9**

We just concluded our fifth book in our pastors' Zoom calls. I love these times of weekly fellowship and personal growth with my fellow pastors in our network. Key aspects to every week's discussion are introspection and application of what we read and discuss. In the end, we are all learning new things about ourselves and our ministries. It requires a teachable heart.

My mother instilled a thought into my young heart, "Jeff, I can gain something from every sermon I hear, no matter how good the delivery is." That stuck with me and I have found myself rehearsing that conviction many times through the years. It runs akin to a much needed discipline for healthy pastors: pastors need to remain teachable with an open heart to the Lord.

When I was a student at CBC (a long time ago) one of my classmates said to me, "I don't ever take him [a certain professor] because I can tell he stopped learning a long time ago. He is using the same material he's used all these years." The point? The professor had stopped learning and had nothing fresh to offer his students.

God wants us to remain teachable for a number of reasons. First, we all have blindspots. Until we reach perfection, God wants to continue His sanctifying work in us. We will not only hurt ourselves, but affect our families and flocks through a stubborn heart that denies the need for personal, ongoing change and growth.

Second, we need to change to meet the demands of today. In the same way that we grow and evolve over time, the world around us continually changes. We need to keep learning in order to remain effective in meeting the needs of our world.

Third, we need to stay fresh in life. Contrast these words in the context of being teachable: inquisitive/closed, creative/stuck, contemporary/codgy, humble/prideful, growing/complete, and expanding/shrinking. A teachable spirit approaches every day with the mindset that God has something new to share with His kids. We need to embrace it.

I have left many a conversation thinking, “Now that guy is still learning. Still growing.” It’s an attractive trait. Imagine what that does for not only our congregations, but our spouses and family members and close friends.

HOW TO REMAIN TEACHABLE:

- Ask yourself: “What did I learn today? This week?”
- Invite the Holy Spirit to help you in daily, personal growth.
- Talk to a friend about your desire to keep growing.

The Lord brought me to Teen Challenge after I spent several years of struggling with addiction. Alcohol consumption at the age of 12 quickly escalated to me using meth at the age of 14.

Homeless and intravenously using meth and heroin at the age of 18 left me in a place of despair! After several arrests and hospitalizations, my only hope was for the Lord to intervene.

While doing time in jail, I reached out to my pastor friend and asked if he would help me get into Teen Challenge. After pleading with the judge, I was given the opportunity to be released early with the agreement that I would enter the program.

Upon completing Teen Challenge, I decided to commit to an internship and serve as a staff member.

Working at Teen Challenge became an advantage for me while going to school. I have a godly community and a wealth of wise council.

While serving as a staff, I was able to obtain my GED, an associate, and a Bachelor of Science degree in Nonprofit Leadership and Management with a concentration on American Indian Studies. Currently, I'm utilizing a full-ride scholarship at TCMI (Training Christians for Ministry International) for a master's degree in organizational leadership and practical theology.

In August 2022, I will also begin a master's program in Global Management at ASU.

I'm so grateful for Teen Challenge teaching me how to follow Christ and strive for excellence. **All glory to God!**

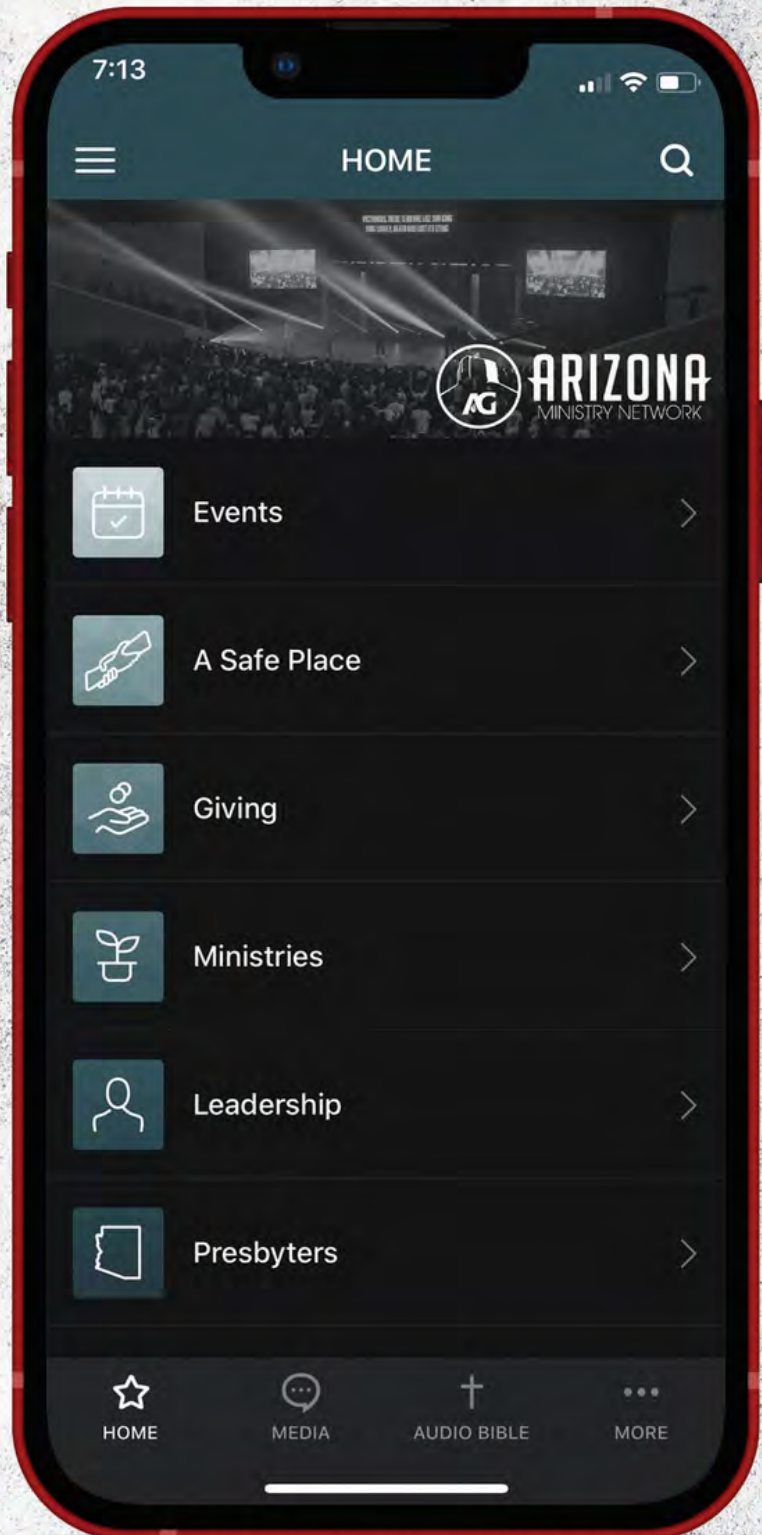
